<p><u>Healthy</u></p> <p>This category is assigned to friendly cats/kittens that can be made available for adoption and who have no excessive or problematic behavioral issues</p>	<p><u>Treatable-Rehabilitatable</u></p> <p>This category is assigned to cats/kittens who have typical normal behaviors which are excessive or problematic, but are able to return to a Healthy status.</p>
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Initial shyness when exposed to novelty (new people, objects, situations) 2. Jumping on elevated perches 3. Normal play behavior scratching, biting, etc. 4.
