DL approached the kennel front (I had asked him to assist). Spud tensed again, stepped back slightly, and let out a few barks. DL started baby talk and offered treats. Spud took treat from DL but did not eat it. Spud loosened again- wiggles, little jumps, and tail wags. DL entered the kennel and was able to easily remove the harness. DL gave Spud a few pets and exited without incident.

There was still a hard mark indent where I could see the bite on the back of the hand, but no skin was broken. Pulling increased as we returned to kennels. DL Was rolling a trashcan on the far side of parking lot. Spud glanced at him, then continued to intake door. CP was passing through as we entered. Spud pulled towards her, sniffing. Returned to kennel, tossed treats to distract while I exited.

I approached Spud's kennel from the outside, calling his name in a high pitch. He ran out, body stiff, tail wagging, and barked. When I got a little closer his body softened and he sat down with tail fast wagging and body loose. At times tip tapping his feet and licking his lip. Readily took treats. I moved away a few times towards truck wash to see how he would react, while he whine barked a few times he remained loose and watching me. I went in with him and he hopped around, tail wagging, nosing at the door. Jumped up on me once when I took the leash off to adjust it. Body loose the whole time. Pulled hard out of kennel, pulls hard on leash. Should use a harness when walking him.

We exited out the front and the Security guard was standing about 20 ft away. Spud noticed him and barked a couple times, pulling towards him. No growling. I was able to redirect his attention pretty quickly and walk him over to the agility gate. He glanced at the security guard a couple more times but did not bark at him. Walked around agility and in a play yard. Picked up tennis ball and carried it in his mouth for the rest of the time. Walked around the play yard, did not chase tennis balls, mostly walked with me. Once back on leash again pulling. Returned to kennel, slight pulling towards dogs barking from kennels but easy to return to kennel and unleash. Held the ball in his mouth the whole time, did not react to leash being removed and handling around his head.

Greeted Spud at outside kennel run. He had a loose body and wiggly butt/tail. Wiggles increased as I approached using baby talk. Took treats gently through kennel bars. Opened door and slip lead easily. Exited confidently with a high wagging tail. Barked at singular barking neighbor, gave wide berth and continued on. Walked to front parking lot and he had a bloody stool. After, he caught sight of multiple people walking, headed in/ out of cars, and began to pull and bark with some growling. Walked him farther away and he would settle but it was busy out front and we weren't able to walk undisturbed, so I had us turn around and head back to kennel. Allowed contact throughout this and once away from front area significantly loosened up. In kennel he was very affectionate, rubbing up against me and giving kisses. Gave a few treats then exited.

Adoption Show

Spud was returned from a walk directly to Play Yard 1 for an adoption show. while walking past other dogs became reactive started barking and pulling towards dogs in kennel and continued to focus on kenneled dogs once in yard, other dogs continued to bark for duration of show. I was able to trade leashes with the volunteer and tried to switch Spud's attention to potential adopters. He switched from barking at kenneled dogs to barking at potential adopters, dilated eyes, hackles raised, fast high wagging tail, at some points standing on hind legs and yowling / wailing at them. During this time he continued to allow me to handle and touch him, at no point did he switch his attention to me. I released the leash to see if he would settle with some distance. He walked around the group for a second and then returned to the behavior. I then retrieved the leash, once I had him he began lunging at 2 of the potential adopters 3-4 times. I was holding him back so no contact was made. At this point I ended the show and returned Spud to his kennel, during which he continued to allow all handling and contact from me. I returned about 5 minutes later to check on him,

at this point he presented with relaxed body, relaxed eyes, heavy panting, slow low tail wags.

PLAYGROUP

Greeting: Ran up to fence. Tail high and wagging. Sniffing. Started to bark with teeth. Then panting, walking, tail high. Walking along the fence. Barrier reactivity behavior. Relaxed and high tail.

Entry: Leash to leash greeting with Dotty 336925. Initially sniffing the yard then turned to sniff her, FDBD sniffs. Loose and tail wagging. Took her correction. Not focused on her, would sniff handlers and the yard, then attempt to engage with her again.

Yard Summary: Barrier reactivity when a new dog came up to the fence, bark and growl. But then relaxed and sniffed with wagging tail. Exit: Bumped to test new dogs.

Walk:

Greeted Spud at his inside kennel. Had a tense body. Used baby voice and offered hot dog, which he took hesitantly. Presented my leash and asked if he wanted to go for a walk. He perked up and began to take the treats readily. Went around to outside run, called him with same voice and holding up leash, he gave some defensive barks and remained in his position by the inside door. Opened door and offered hot dog, he began to approach but retreated as adjacent dogs were barking and slamming against metal walls. Exited and shut in neighbors. Re entered kennel and he approached me slowly but with a low wagging tail. Took treats and allowed me to leash him. Confidently exited kennel. Took a loong pee. Pulled down to agility. Had three separate large bowel movements. Potential "holds it" / "house trained". Responded to pressure on leash but with constant pulling ended up coughing from the pressure. Recommend walking him on a harness. Accepted contact but did not solicit. Returned to kennel without issue, approached me readily after I had dropped the leash, taking more treats. Tried to exit with me as I left kennel.

The closest camera to the location points to the loading dock and not outward. Given this information and no cameras in the area, case closed. Recommendations: K9 to be dispositioned per management.

- Dog- Fear

The dog that you are adopting has either a history of fearful behavior in their previous home or we have observed the dog exhibiting fearful behavior in the shelter environment. With proper intervention this behavior can be managed in their new home.

Why are dogs fearful?

Some dogs experience a lack of socialization during their critical puppy development periods and may display more fearful behavior in new situations. This behavior can be seen as avoidance, fearful body postures and growling. These experiences can cause the dog to avoid interactions with new people, dogs or other novel stimuli. Sometimes dogs exhibit fairly normal behavior within the environment, but avoid certain types of interaction with people that are new to them. They require a trusting relationship to be comfortable with odd interactions like hugging or raucous play. A risk that any fearful dog can pose is that, when forced to interact with a stimulus (person, dog, new situation) they can react defensively and growl, snap or bite to try to make the scary thing go away. These behaviors need to be managed to help prevent the development of further reactivity. Not every home environment is appropriate for a shy dog; your adoption counselor will help you evaluate your particular situation.

How do I help my dog with its fearful behavior?

* Understand your dog's threshold. Your dog has a threshold under which they are still able to make good decisions and learn new behaviors. Once they reach their threshold it is best to remove them from the situation and allow them to calm down before working with them again. Once they are back under threshold, the situation may still be challenging for them but it can help to build confidence, reduce stress and help to form positive associations for them.

* Pay attention to what your dog is saying. Every dog has a progression of behaviors that can build up to an unmanageable level of fear. Knowing when your dog is approaching an uncomfortable point is necessary to help them to either avoid the stimulus or practise calming behavior.

* Desensitizing and counterconditioning are great tools to teach dogs that scary people or situations are not as frightening as they feel they are. Use treats or wet food to slowly acclimate your dog to the stimulus. Start with the stimulus in a non-threatening form (such as a picture of another dog, or a strange person at a distance). Gradually increase exposure to the stimulus until the dog is comfortable and not expressing any fearful behaviors. By rewarding the dog each time it makes a good decision about the scary stimulus, it will gradually become less and less scary and the dog will begin to have positive associations with it.

* Make sure to communicate to visitors to your home or strangers on the street how to properly interact with your dog. If it is going to cause your dog too much stress, or they have not progressed to a point in their training where it would be beneficial to the dog, remove them from the situation and do not force an interaction.

What if my adopted dog shows fear in the new home?
