- Dog- Fear

The dog that you are adopting has either a history of fearful behavior in their previous home or we have observed the dog exhibiting fearful behavior in the shelter environment. With proper intervention this behavior can be managed in their new home.

**Why are dogs fearful?**

Some dogs experience a lack of socialization during their critical puppy development periods and may display more fearful behavior in new situations. This behavior can be seen as avoidance, fearful body postures and growling. These experiences can cause the dog to avoid interactions with new people, dogs or other novel stimuli. Sometimes dogs exhibit fairly normal behavior within the environment, but avoid certain types of interaction with people that are new to them. They require a trusting relationship to be comfortable with odd interactions like hugging or raucous play. A risk that any fearful dog can pose is that, when forced to interact with a stimulus (person, dog, new situation) they can react defensively and growl, snap or bite to try to make the scary thing go away. These behaviors need to be managed to help prevent the development of further reactivity. Not every home environment is appropriate for a shy dog; your adoption counselor will help you evaluate your particular situation.

How do I help my dog with its fearful behavior?

\* Understand your dog's threshold. Your dog has a threshold under which they are still able to make good decisions and learn new behaviors. Once they reach their threshold it is best to remove them from the situation and allow them to calm down before working with them again. Once they are back under threshold, the situation may still be challenging for them but it can help to build confidence, reduce stress and help to form positive associations for them.

\* Pay attention to what your dog is saying. Every dog has a progression of behaviors that can build up to an unmanageable level of fear. Knowing when your dog is approaching an uncomfortable point is necessary to help them to either avoid the stimulus or practise calming behavior.

\* Desensitizing and counterconditioning are great tools to teach dogs that scary people or situations are not as frightening as they feel they are. Use treats or wet food to slowly acclimate your dog to the stimulus. Start with the stimulus in a non-threatening form (such as a picture of another dog, or a strange person at a distance). Gradually increase exposure to the stimulus until the dog is comfortable and not expressing any fearful behaviors. By rewarding the dog each time it makes a good decision about the scary stimulus, it will gradually become less and less scary and the dog will begin to have positive associations with it.

\* Make sure to communicate to visitors to your home or strangers on the street how to properly interact with your dog. If it is going to cause your dog too much stress, or they have not progressed to a point in their training where it would be beneficial to the dog, remove them from the situation and do not force an interaction.

What if my adopted dog shows fear in the new home?

- Medical Condition

MCAS veterinary team has diagnosed this animal with the following condition:

Congenital deformity/agenesis of left side of nose, left upper lip, and left rostral maxilla resulting in a cleft between the nose and left upper lip and an oronasal fistula between teeth 202 and 203. This dog seems able to eat and drink adequately and isn't showing signs of inflammation/infection or discomfort related to congenital deformity at the at this time, so surgical repair isn't considered a necessity at this time. He will likely be more prone to infection of his nasal cavity and aspiration over the course of his life than typical dogs are. Please consult with your veterinarian about this condition.

- Ear Infection

The dog or cat that you are adopting has been treated for an ear infection. Most ear infections occur in the outer ear (otitis externa), but they can also occur in the middle ear (otitis media) or the inner ear (otitis interna).

**What causes an ear infection?**

Foreign material, bathing/swimming, ear mites, polyps, and tumors can predispose ears to infection. Others may be secondary to an underlying health condition, such as a hormonal disorder or allergies. Certain dog breeds and those with long, floppy ears are more susceptible.

**What are the signs?**

The symptoms can include odor, ear discharge, head shaking, ear scratching, redness, pain, and general lethargy.

**How is it diagnosed?**

Many ear infections can be diagnosed on exam or by looking into the ear with a scope. The discharge may be examined under a microscope to determine the type of infection.

**What treatment is needed?**

Most ear infections are easy to treat with a thorough ear cleaning and a medicated ointment. However, if the infection is neglected or there is an underlying health condition, it can become chronic. Symptoms can become severe and the infection may spread into the middle or inner ear. Chronic infections can be difficult to treat, with some that may never be completely cured. Many recurrent ear infections have an underlying cause that needs to be addressed.

**What do I need to do next?**

An ear cleaning and topical medication have already been given. The ears should be monitored regularly so treatment can be started early if an infection develops again. If symptoms return, the adopter should speak with their own veterinarian to develop a treatment plan.

Any future treatments or diagnostics will be the responsibility of the adopter.

- Dog - Neuter Post Operative Care

This dog was neutered (castrated) at Multnomah County Animal Services.

Please keep your dog quiet (no running or jumping) for the next 7-10 days. Keep him indoors where he can stay clean, dry, and warm. He should not be bathed for 10 days after surgery.

If your dog had surgery the same day he was picked up, he may have mild, lingering effects from anesthesia, such as being easily startled or not as alert as usual.

Please check the incision on, or in front of the scrotum twice a day for 10 days. A small amount of blood-tinged drainage from incisions on the scrotum can be normal for 1-2 days after surgery. Redness and swelling should be minimal. Please do not allow your dog to lick or chew at the incision. There may be a small green tattoo in the groin area to show that he has been sterilized. Unless otherwise indicated, there are no sutures to be removed.

Your dog can be offered food and water after returning home. Some dogs may have a temporary loss of appetite, but should start eating within 24 hours of surgery.

Please keep other pets and small children away from this pet for the first two days after surgery.

If you have any questions or concerns directly related to surgery during the recovery period, please call MCAS' Animal Health team at (503) 988-9075. MCAS will evaluate and treat free of charge postoperative complications arising from surgery. If it is after-hours and you are unable to reach us, and are concerned about a medical emergency, please contact a 24-hour emergency veterinary hospital.
